DEMPSEY DEFEATS ARMOUR.

**Georgian Takes Shenecosset Golf
Final from Scot by 3 and 2.**

NEW LONDON, Conn., Aug. 20.—N.

A. Dempsey of Macon, Ga., won the championship of the Shenecosset Country Club here today when he defeated T. D. Armour, of the Lothianburn Club, Scotland, the French amateur champion, in the final round by 3 up and 2 to play. The morning round of eighteen holes was all even. Armour was badly off his game, particularly on the greens, all morning and the first part of the afternoon.

In the morning Armour played carelessly and allowed himself to slip on eight holes where he had fine chances to win. In the afternoon Dempsey started off well. He took advantage of every slip that Armour made and rounded the turn 4 up. Then Armour settled down and won the eleventh. Dempsey was nervous here and missed a short putt. On the next he drove into a trap, overran the green twice and picked up, with his lead cut down to two.

Dempsey was thought to have very little chance. On the next, however, Armour lost his ball on a long second near the green, and Dempsey, who had also been in serious trouble, won the hole. The Georgian lost the next, picking up his ball, but the delay had given him a chance to recover his game. Armour missed another short putt on the fifteenth, which gave his opponent the hole down to three. The Scot was unable to get better than a half on the next and last.
