ARMOUR REACHES FINAL.

Will Clash Today With Leblond for
Shenecossett Golf Crown.

NEW LONDON, Conn., Aug. 18.—Tommy Armour, former Scotch and French amateur golf champion, and H. R. Leblond, of Cincinnati, will meet as the finalists in the annual Shenecossett championship tomorrow. Armour defeated George Collett of Providence today, 2 and 1, after a close match. The match was all-even going to the fifteenth, and Collett had a chance to win until his second shot rimmed the cup and he failed to sink the return.

The only New Yorker in the semi-finals, B. T. Couderf, of Piping Rock, put up a hard fight against Leblond, and only lost on the eighteenth where his par four was beaten by Leblond's birdie three.

The semi-finals of the second flight resulted in victories for W. R. Harper, Merion Cricket Club, and P. M. Kerridge, New London. The former won another close match from Dean Pawl, Siwanoy, in 19 holes, and the latter drew a default from Philip Randolph Jr., Point Judith.

In the third flight, J. P. Taylor Armstrong, Shenecossett, defeated George Smart, Hartford, 1 up. W. S. Lines, Hartford, defeated R. B. Page, Hartford, 2 up.
