NEW LONDON, Conn., July 31. Max Marston, Merion, former na-tional amateur champion, today won the Shenecossett Country Club's eighth invitation tournament by de-feating W. K. Lanman of Columbus, Ohio, 1 up, in thirty-six holes of spectacular play. Lanman, champion of Yale, and captain-elect of the team, played good golf, but Marston was just a shade better.

Marston's score this afternoon was 37-33-70, two under par for the course, and, in losing, Lanman was only one stroke above par, going out in 36 and coming back in 37 for a 73.

As in his previous matches Marston was in the rear most of the way. It was not until the thirty-third hole of the final round that he evened the match. He did that by winning the fifteenth with a birdie 2, and be-came 1 up by winning the tricky six-teenth with a birdie 3.

Marston On in Two.

Lanman made a splendid try to square the match at the seventeenth, when he sent a perfect iron shot to
