MRS. VARE DEFEATS MISS BAUER, 5 AND 4

Takes Griswold Golf Cup for
Seventh Time on Return to
Shenecosssett Tourney.

PLAYS STEADILY IN FINAL

Winner Fails to Lose a Hole in
Match With Providence Star
on Eastern Point Links.

EASTERN POINT, Conn., July 19.—Mrs. Glenna Collett Vare of Philadelphia won the Griswold Cup for the seventh time when she defeated Miss Jean Bauer of Providence, R. I., today, 5 and 4, in the final of the seventeenth annual Shenecosssett women's invitation golf tournament.

Without losing one of the fourteen holes played, Mrs. Vare gave another exhibition of the golf that once gave her the title of the nation's greatest woman golfer. The large gallery practically concurred Mrs. Vare the match long before the finish.

As methodical as ever on the Shenecosssett course, scene of her rise to golfing fame, Mrs. Vare played the first nine holes in 38, two over women's par. She made a poor start with a 6 on the par 4 first but played the remaining holes on the outward route in par.

Falters After Turn.

Four up at the turn, Mrs. Vare won the tenth and halved the next four holes to end the match. Of the five incoming holes she played over par on three.

Miss Bauer, tournament winner in 1934, had trouble with her putting throughout the match, and this cost her several holes. With improved putting she could have won several of the holes that were halved.

The finalists halved the first as both drove into a sand trap and shot past the green. Mrs. Vare won the next two holes, and they halved the fourth, fifth and sixth in par figures.

Cards One Birdie.

Mrs. Vare shot the only birdie of the day on the par 5 seventh, sinking a twelve-foot putt, while her opponent missed an eight-footer and took a 5. Miss Bauer failed on another eight-foot putt on the eighth and had to halve the hole. She went 4 down when Mrs. Vare won the ninth with a thirty-five-foot putt for a par 4.

Mrs. Vare won the tenth with a fifteen-foot putt as her opponent failed to run down another short one. The competitors halved the next four holes, and the match ended at the fourteenth.

Mrs. Vare's triumph came on her return to the tournament after a two-year absence from formal Shenecosssett competition.
