MARSTON TURNS BACK LEE IN FINAL, 4 AND 2

Veteran Annexes Shenecossett Golf Title for Seventh Time at Eastern Point

EASTERN POINT, Conn., Aug. 1 (AP).—Max Marston of Philadelphia won his seventh title since 1926 in the Shenecossett men's invitation golf tournament today by defeating Jimmy Lee of Danbury, Georgetown University star, 4 and 2, in the 36-hole final.

Marston led all the way after winning the first hole, and threatened to turn the match into a rout in the morning as he went around in 73 strokes, one over par, to lead, 5 up, at lunch time.

But the 22-year-old collegian, who had not been born when Marston first achieved prominence in golf, made a battle of it in the afternoon.

Playing sensational golf over the first eleven holes of the afternoon round, Lee cut Marston's lead. He shot a brilliant 34, two under par, for the third nine holes, and put himself back in the match by winning the twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth as Marston went one over par on each and saw his lead dwindle to 2 up.

The Philadelphian started pulling away again at the thirty-first, which he won, and he increased his lead with a birdie 3 at the thirty-second.
