No one at the Greenwich Country Club doubted Walter Hagen's right to the National Open Championship when the title holder came home in 30 during a four-ball match at the Greenwich Country Club, and with Fred Herreshoff as his partner won the Amateur-Professional Competition with a best ball of 65. Hagen's inward journey was one of the most brilliant bits of golf ever played in this country and reached its climax at the 440-yard thirteenth, where he holed a full midiron shot for a 2, a shot that will live long in the memory of every golfer who was lucky enough to see it. Hagen's individual score with two holes not putted out was 68.

So many entries are being received by the committee in charge of the Father and Son Tournament to be held at the Sleepy Hollow Country Club June 21st that it is believed the event will be one of the largest in point of number of players and interest of any tournament held in the Metropolitan district this season.

The Sleepy Hollow Club has extended to all entrants in the tournament the free use of its course on Friday, June 18th.

The committee has departed from the usual custom of giving cups as prizes and has had designed a very appropriate and beautiful medal. The father and son making the lowest net score will each receive one of these medals in gold. Silver and bronze medals will be given to the pairs making the second and third best net scores.
