DOG DAYS HERE TO REMAIN FOR NEXT SIX WEEKS

FORTY-DAY PERIOD, WHEN SIRI-
US IN ASCENDANT, BEGAN
SATURDAY

The Dog days, always anticipated as
hot, heavy and moist, are now here,
having arrived Saturday, following
closely upon the period of humid wea-
ther which has been true to typical
dog-day tradition. From ancient times
dog days have existed in the minds of
peoples and the original belief has
been so firmly fixed that modern dis-
coveries in astronomy have not dissi-
pated the theory of weather affected
by a star.

By accident, the great heat of sum-
mer in such old countries as Greece
coincided with the heliacal rising of
Sirius, or the dog star, the brightest
and largest of all the fixed stars, situ-
ated in the mouth of Canis Major.
For this reason, the people and astron-
omers of those days became convinced
that the 20 days preceding the 20 days
following the rising of the star caused
the heat and diseases of mid-summer,
and the legend has persisted to this
day. The fact that owing to precession
the star rises later every year in all
latitudes and its rising depends upon
latitude itself, has had little influence
on this popular idea. In time the dog
star will rise heliacally in the dead of
winter, but no doubt the population of
modern countries will expect the dog
days to occur in August just the same
and will be convinced that any un-
pleasantly hot weather is directly due
to the star's influence.

The uncomfortable weather which
is an invariable occurrence in Ameri-
can summers is undoubtedly merely
due to natural climatic conditions
which vary in an area which is in
the same latitude and should be
equally affected by the star, but
nevertheless the old idea of the an-
cients which was caused entirely by
a coincidence, persists in these mod-
ern times.
